amendment /Revisar y aprobar la enmienda SPSA	K. Schevenin shared that students who teachers also identified as at risk would also be topics of conversation at the wellness meetings for additional support as part of MTSS.
	K. Schevenin shared that there is a discrepancy between the perceived at risk students between the general population and the special education population
	6% high risk to 20% high risk between 2021 to 2022 in the 2nd to 3rd grade cohorts.
	There is some calibration that occurs among teachers to norm reference input.
	Regarding a recent incident on campus lunches for 6th grade have needed extra supervision and get additional noon duty supervisors to deter unsafe behaviors.
	Students completed a bullying survey last spring and there is ongoing need for 2nd step (Social Emotional Learning Curriculum) implementation.
	Ongoing revamped PBIS PRIDE lessons and implementation. During Tier 1 implementation there is a clear flow chart for teacher managed and office managed behaviors. There are about 14,000 Golden Tickets being redeemed each month at the student store. Tier 1 behaviorist is coaching students in the classroom. Counseling room has become available for students to play quietly during lunch recess M,W,F. There are some limitations given the space and staffing.
	There is a sense from staff and families that reactions should be more punitive, but there is a need for additional support and tools.
	D. Decker asked about the reason for the conflict.

		According to CHKS of 24 parents 42% of parents identified bullying as a "large problem" while 83% of parents felt teachers were very responsive to their children's SEL needs. According to school site data on bullying pulled February 2022 for 2021-2022 only 2 incidents fell under the state definition of bullying where suspension was applied.
		NVIH Social Worker is also working in our wellness center to meet the needs of students.
		In fall roughly 16,000 was reallocated to pay teachers for grade-level PLC time. It hasn't been used. Proposal is to reallocate funds for PLC from Goal 2 to Goal 1 at \$8,8750 to allow K-3 students to participate in a 6 week art instruction from Yolo Arts.
		Matt made a motion to approve moving \$8,750 from Goal 2 to Goal 1 for VAPA. Seconded by Debbie Decker. All in favor. Passed unanimously.
