Goal 4 4-6 grades want food for recognition for perfect attendance instead of pins but acknowledged that K-3 might appreciate the pins. D.Decker noted that one rationale for data points mentioned is staff turnover, and inexperienced staff. D. Decker asked about insights into turnover. K. Schevenin mentioned that one factor is the needs of the student population is a challenge for new teachers. A. Delgadillo added that the needs of students is so high that despite his own 10 years of experience prior to arriving 8 years ago it was still a challenging population of students to work with.

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para el plan 24-25	K. Schevenin noted that there are a variety of reasons including staff relocation and staff felt that there isn't a lot of appreciation for the challenges of the site.
	 D. Decker asked if stronger supports would result in a reduced need of intervention. K. Schevenin shared that in their PROMESA grant training had been making a lot of progress but there will be a restart because of the amount of staff turnover. B. Ibarra- Avalos asked about the cost of an Instructional Coach. C. K. Schevenin added that it's about \$100K. About that much money is currently targeted at Reading Intervention Specialists. C. Minor asked about the Puma Pals support for teachers. K. Schevenin explained that it is a system to support new teachers to the site who were not in induction. K. Schevenin shared that bullying related behaviors have been identified as a big problem by staff, students, and families more than almost any other site including secondary sites. One goal was to fully implement Second Step including the bullying unit, but it was fizzled out. A.Delgadillo noted that as a mentor he's shared that if it's important then staff will make it a priority. D. Decker asked about the awards assembly focused mostly on academics but not on character.
	K. Schevenin responded that she agrees and wants to focus on implementing both academic and character recognition in the future.There are good news referrals but only 1-2 staff use them consistently.
